

	<p>Data may be communicated to external parties operating as autonomous data controllers, by way of example, supervisory bodies or authorities, as well as any public or private organisation entitled to request data.</p> <p>Data may also be communicated or processed, on behalf of the Company, by external parties appointed as Data Processors, who are given adequate operating instructions. These subjects are essentially included in the following categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • companies that offer accounting, tax and insurance services; • companies that offer mail services; • companies that offer receipts and payments management services; • agencies that offer events management services, as well as media relations agencies; • consulting companies and audit firms. <p>Data may be communicated to companies belonging to Ariston Group which carry out specific activities, by way of example, enter into agreements, place orders, goods receipt, management of payments.</p>

	SUBJECTS AUTHORIZED TO PROCESSING DATA
	<p>The data may be processed by employees of the corporate units responsible for pursuing the aforementioned purposes, that have been expressly authorized to process and have received adequate operating instructions.</p>

	PERSONAL DATA TRANSFERS OUTSIDE THE EU
	<p>Where personal data are transferred to countries outside the European Union (EU) or the European Economic Area (EEA) that have not been deemed adequate by the European Commission, the transfer mechanisms set forth in Article 46 of the GDPR (such as standard contractual clauses) will be used, with consideration given to whether "additional measures" are appropriate to ensure a level of protection substantially equivalent to that required by EU law.</p>

	DATA SUBJECTS' RIGHTS - COMPLAINT TO THE SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY
	<p>Data subjects can contact the Data Controller by sending a written communication to Ariston S.p.A., viale Aristide Merloni 45, 60044 Fabriano (AN), Italy, or via e-mail sent to privacy.ariston@ariston.com in order to request access to personal data concerning them, the rectification of inaccurate data, the integration of incomplete data, the erasure of personal data, the restriction of processing of the data in the cases set out in article 18 of the GDPR, where applicable, as well as the right to and object at any time, in whole or in part, on grounds relating to their particular situation, to the processing of data in the case of legitimate interests of the Data Controller.</p>
	<p>Furthermore, in the case where processing is based on consent or a contract and carried out with automated tools, data subjects have the right to receive the personal data in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format, and to transmit the data to another data controller without hindrances.</p> <p>Data subjects have the right to lodge a complaint with the competent Supervisory Authority in the member state where they are resident or where they work, or the member state where the alleged breach took place.</p>
